(Los Angeles, CA) Oct 4, 2022 — Cuba's celebrated **Malpaso Dance Company** comes to The Soraya for the first time on Thursday, Oct. 13 with three major pieces that capture the soul of the island nation, its aspirations, and its proud cultural identity alike. In its "Signature Series" style, The Soraya once again brings live music together with dance as Arturo O'Farrill and the Afro Latin Jazz Ensemble perform "24 Hours and a Dog" for the company which was created by Malpaso Artistic Director Osnel Delgado.

The company also performs "woman with water" by Matts Ek, and "Stillness in Bloom," a new piece by Canadian-born choreographer Aszure Barton, co-commissioned by The Soraya. First performed in Havana in December 2021, "Stillness in Bloom" is a timely exploration of isolation and longed-for reunions.

About Malpaso Dance Company

In the 10 years since its establishment in 2012, Malpaso Dance Company has become one of the most sought-after Cuban dance companies with a growing international profile. Emphasizing a collaborative creative process, Malpaso is committed to working with top international choreographers while also nurturing new voices in Cuban choreography. The company tours with 11 dancers and is led by its original three founders: resident choreographer and Artistic Director Osnel Delgado, Executive Director Fernando Sáez, and dancer and cofounder Daile Carrazana.

Malpaso has commissioned original works from a number of prominent international choreographers, including Ron K. Brown ("Why You Follow"), Trey McIntyre ("Under Fire"), Aszure Barton ("Indomitable Waltz" and "Stillness in Bloom"), Emmy-award winning Sonya Tayeh ("Face the Torrent") and Robyn Mineko Williams ("Elemental").

As a means of foregrounding Cuban choreographers, Malpaso recently has also worldpremiered a work by company member Daile Carrazana ("*Nana para un Insomnio*" – or "*Lullaby for Insomnia*") bolstering the list of long-toured pieces by Artistic Director Delgado, notably, "*Ocaso*" as well as "24 Hours and a Dog" and "*Dreaming of Lions*," which are often accompanied live by Grammy [®] Award-winning, Cuban-American composer/pianist Arturo O'Farrill and the Afro Latin Jazz Ensemble.

The company's repertory includes "*Tabula Rasa*" by world-renowned Israeli choreographer Ohad Naharin, who traveled to Cuba in spring of 2018 specifically to work one on one with Malpaso dancers to crystalize the re-staging of this seldom performed piece; and "*woman with water*" by the distinguished Swedish choreographer Mars Ek, who also travelled to Havana for the work's premiere at Martí Theatre on December 2021.

About The Soraya's Signature Series

The ongoing Signature Series embraces all the art forms, and by shedding series structured by artistic disciplines, the 17 performances in the Signature Series present new programming opportunities. From pieces produced entirely by The Soraya, to Jazz titans and Broadway favorites, the series also gives patrons more flexibility in choosing which performances to enjoy.

Highlights of The Soraya's 2022-23 season feature the World Premiere of *Treelogy*, a three-part musical reflection on California's wildfires and their impact on the state's three beloved trees species – the Joshua tree, the Giant Sequoia, and the Coastal Redwood. The concert features three original compositions by **Billy Childs, Steven Mackey**, and **Gabriella Smith**, commissioned by The Soraya and performed by artist-in-residence Étienne Gara and Delirium Musicum. In addition, other events to be found solely at The Soraya are a musical tribute to American activist **Dolores Huerta** produced by The Soraya, the continuation of the *Hecho en las Américas* series featuring **Luis Enrique + C4 Trio** with special guest Grammy Award winner **Nella**, and pianist **Emily Bear** joins **Los Angeles Jewish Symphony** to perform the *Premiere of Suite from the Video Game Syberia: The World Before.*
