Violins of Hope

This rare program will bring 60 violins from Israel to Los Angeles, each instrument a "survivor" of the Holocaust. With concerts throughout the region, an exhibit at the Los Angeles Museum of the Holocaust, and our first-ever Artist in Residence, The Soraya will bring Violins of Hope to audiences and students far and wide.

The Violins of Hope will also feature the most ambitious Arts Education programming in our history.

THE VIOLINS OF HOPE PROGRAM:

- · Will be the focus of the Soraya's 8th Annual Summer Arts Institute.
- Include 40 50 in-school workshops at local schools.
- · Culminate with a special FREE student matinee concert featuring one of the historic violins played by Artist in Residence, Niv Ashkenazi. (Note: to attend the free matinee, a school representative must attend the Summer Arts Institute.

student engagement and foster creativity in each lesson.

- Explore how the arts can be a powerful partner to capture the historical significance and emotional weight of this difficult material.
- Invite Niv Ashkenazi to join us to share his expertise on the subject and play his priceless Violins of Hope instrument.

Niv will also be on hand to help educators prepare for the in-school workshops offered to any educator who attends The Soraya's Summer Arts Institute. Attendees will also have special priority to bring their students to the FREE student matinee in March 2020.
