(Los Angeles, CA) Oct. 31, 2023— The Soraya's 2023/2024 Season continues in November with two extraordinary nights of classical music — Esa-Pekka Salonen returns to The Soraya to conduct the Colburn Orchestra on Sat, Nov 4 at 8pm, followed by the astonishing violinist Midori performing with Festival Strings Lucerne on Thu, Nov 9 at 8pm.

The Colburn Orchestra: Shostakovich, Brahms, and Ogonek conducted by Esa-Pekka Salonen

A beloved Los Angeles institution for more than three decades, Esa-Pekka Salonen is now the Music Director of San Francisco Symphony, but continues to make the Southland his home- away-from-home, as head of the Negaunee Conducting Program at the Colburn School. He returns to The Soraya for the fourth time leading Brahms Symphony No. 4 which premiered in 1885, a piece described by many experts as being inspired by and closely related to Beethoven's symphonies. The program also features a contemporary piece by Elizabeth Ogonek as part of the California Festival: A Celebration of New music, a two-week statewide music initiative showcasing the most compelling and forward-looking voices in performances of works written in the past five years.

Midori makes her Soraya debut with Festival Strings Lucerne led by Daniel Dodds

On Thursday, November 9, Midori will make her debut on The Soraya's Great Hall stage with the Lucerne String Quartet led by Artist Director Daniel Dodds.

Wowing audiences since her debut with The New York Philharmonic at the age of 11, the Japanese-born phenom joins the Swiss ensemble Festival Strings Lucerne for her debut at The Soraya. Midori is equally at home on concert stages worldwide as she is in her role as global human rights activist. Though debuting at The Soraya, she is no stranger to Los Angeles, where she acts as Distinguished Professor at USC. She appears twice on the program—Beethoven's Romance in F major and Robert Schumann's Violin Concerto in D minor, a piece shrouded in mystery, having been relegated to secrecy for eight decades following Schumann's death in 1856. The program closes with Beethoven's Symphony No. 4, one of the least performed of his symphonic works.
