# Broadway Star Eva Noblezada Joins Pacific Jazz Orchestra to Launch The Soraya's 4th Annual Jazz at Naz Festival

The GRAMMY Award-winner and Two-Time Tony Award Nominee will launch LA's only month-long jazz festival

(Los Angeles, CA) September 20, 2024 — Powerhouse singer and actress Eva Noblezada will open the 2025 Jazz at Naz festival on Saturday, Feb 1 with Chris Walden's Pacific Jazz Orchestra (PJO), marking the start of The Soraya's 4th-annual festival and her Soraya debut. PJO's debut at the Soraya in May 2024 garnered a wildly enthusiastic response from a sold-out audience which featured Broadway megastar, Aaron Tveit. One of the notable aspects of PJO is the unparalleled musical arrangements crafted by Walden, who shapes every number individually. This kind of bespoke programming highlights the thrilling expertise of both the band and the singer.

Eva Noblezada was discovered at 13 years old during a high school singing competition in her hometown of San Diego that led to her performing the title role in *Miss Saigon* in both London and New York. The performances garnered the young actress her first Tony Award nomination and her Broadway debut. Her second came following her starring role as Eurydice in the Anaïs Mitchell musical *Hadestown*, alongside Reeve Carney.

"Noblezada has amassed an impressive list of accomplishments in her young career, including a Grammy award and two Tony nominations. She is best known for her leading roles in *Hadestown* and *The Great Gatsby*. I was recently able to catch one of her performances in *Gatsby* on Broadway, and her portrayal of the iconic American figure, Daisy Buchanan, was riveting. She

brings such depth and complexity to both her acting and singing," said Thor Steingraber, Soraya Executive and Artistic Director. "In addition to Broadway and jazz fans, we are proud to introduce her to the Valley's extensive Filipino American and Mexican American audiences. Noblezada is a Southern California native with deep roots in these vibrant communities."

Seven-time Grammy-nominated composer and arranger Chris Walden is the founder, artistic director and conductor of the 42-piece Pacific Jazz Orchestra (PJO) based on Los Angeles. PJO's inaugural season began in October 2023 and closed in May 2024 at The Soraya with Broadway star Aaron Tveit. The group's highly successful first season featured guest artists such as Rufus Wainwright, TAKE 6, Katharine McPhee, Billy Valentine, and David Foster and has since been received by the community as, "the only such ensemble in the country" (Montecito Journal) as it blends the elements of the jazz big band with a string section while also integrating singers of all genres.

The Feb. 1 concert is the first in the 4<sup>th</sup>-annual Jazz at Naz festival, which features a robust array of talented jazz musicians from around the world and right here with CSUN's own Jazz "A" Band performing and working directly with Jason Moran. In addition to PJO with Eva Noblezada, the 2025 festival includes:

- Jazz Club (230 seats): Lakecia Benjamin with Phoenix & Christian McBride with Ursa Major
- Great Hall (1700 seats): Jason Moran with CSUN Jazz "A" Band; Kurt Elling with Peter Erskine (also of PJO) and Yellowjackets; Chucho Valdès with Arturo Sandoval

The festival will conclude on Feb. 20, 2025 with *Chucho Valdès: Irakere 50* where Valdès will celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Irakere, the band he formed in 1973. The concert comes on the heels of two major accolades for both Valdès and Sandoval—with Valdès becoming a 2025 inductee of the NEA Jazz Masters and Sandoval being named in the 2025 class of the Kennedy Center Honors. *Read more, here*.

# **About Eva Noblezada**

Eva Noblezada is currently starring on Broadway as "Daisy" in The Great Gatsby. She won a GRAMMY© and was nominated for a Tony for *Hadestown*. It was Eva's second Tony nomination in her first two Broadway roles, following her earlier nod in 2017 for the title role of *Miss Saigon*. She was featured in the Amblin feature, "Easter Sunday," and as the lead in the AppleTV+

animated film, "Luck." Previously, she starred for director Diane Paragas in the acclaimed Sony Pictures film, "Yellow Rose." She also starred in the West End revivals of *Miss Saigon* and *Les Misérables*.

### **About Pacific Jazz Orchestra**

The Pacific Jazz Orchestra (PJO) is Los Angeles' new resident 40-piece ensemble for jazz and beyond, presenting an annual concert season consisting of five projects, each with different guest artists. Spread out over a select few venues in L.A., the program reaches far beyond the boundaries of jazz, as it features music of a diverse range of styles, genres, and backgrounds. Walden's vast experience in writing orchestral and big band arrangements in many different styles and working with artists from different backgrounds makes him uniquely qualified to serve as music director, as he can draw from his many connections to artists he has worked with to attract talent for a program.

### About The Soraya's Jazz at Naz festival

Long before the 2011 opening of The Soraya, CSUN Jazz Studies was a national standard bearer—winning awards and training the next generation of artists. Since opening its doors, The Soraya has furthered CSUN's profile with a nonstop procession of jazz greats performing in both The Soraya's Great Hall and its innovative Jazz Club.

Now, the annual <u>Jazz at Naz festival</u> has been recognized as one of the best winter jazz festivals on the West Coast as well as the jazz epicenter in Los Angeles.
