Pianist Emanuel Ax Makes His Long-Awaited Debut at The Soraya

Program will include Beethoven, Schoenberg and Schumann

(Los Angeles, CA) October 15, 2024 — One of the most anticipated debuts of the 2024-25 Season, renowned pianist **Emanuel Ax** brings his extraordinary versatility and brilliance to The Soraya. The pianist is legendary in the recording studio and on stage, and the Sunday, November 3rd performance will feature "Fantasia" standards for classical piano repertoire by Beethoven, Schoenberg, and Schumann. This performance is sponsored by the Colburn Foundation.

"Every season at The Soraya, we welcome a roster of new and returning global artists to our stage," said Thor Steingraber, Soraya Executive and Artistic Director. "Ax's debut appearance marks a milestone for us and is long overdue."

About Emanuel Ax

Born to Polish parents in what is today Lviv, Ukraine, Emanuel Ax moved to Winnipeg, Canada, with his family when he was a young boy. Mr. Ax made his New York debut in the Young Concert Artists Series, and in 1974 won the first Arthur Rubinstein International Piano Competition Tel Aviv. In 1975 he won the Michaels Award of Young Concert Artists, followed years later by the Avery Fisher Prize.

The 2024-25 season begins with a continuation of the Beethoven for Three touring and recording project with partners Leonidas Kavakos and Yo-Yo Ma which takes them European festivals including BBC Proms, Dresden, Hamburg, Vienna and Luxembourg. As guest soloists he will appear during the New York Philharmonic opening week which will mark his 47th annual visit to the orchestra. During the season he will return to the Cleaveland and Philadelphia orchestras, National, San Diego, Nashville and Pittsburgh symphonies and Rochester Philharmonic. A fall recital tour from Toronto and Boston moves west to include San Francisco, Seattle and Los Angles culminating in the spring in Chicago and his annual Carnegie Hall appearance. A special project in duo with clarinetist Anthony McGill takes them from the west coast through the mid-west to Georgia and Carnegie Hall and in chamber music with Itzhak Perlman and Friends to Los Angeles, Santa Barbara and San Francisco. An extensive European tour twill include concerts in Paris, Oslo, Cologne, Hamburg, Berlin, Warsaw and Israel.

Mr. Ax has been a Sony Classical exclusive recording artist since 1987 and following the success of the Brahms Trios with Kavakos and Ma, the trio launched an ambitious, multi-year project to record all the Beethoven Trios and Symphonies arranged for trio which the first three discs have been released. He has received GRAMMY Awards for the second and third volumes of his cycle of Haydn's piano sonatas. He has

also made a series of GRAMMY-winning recordings with Yo Yo Ma of the Beethoven and Brahms sonatas for cello and piano. In the 2004-5 season Mr. Ax contributed to an International EMMY Award-winning BBC documentary commemorating the Holocaust that aired on the 60th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. In 2013, Mr. Ax's recording Variations received the Echo Klassik Award for Solo Recording of the Year (19th Century Music/Piano).

Mr. Ax is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and holds honorary doctorates of music from Skidmore College, New England Conservatory of Music, Yale University and Columbia University. www.emanuelax.com

Located on the vibrant campus of California State University Northridge (CSUN), The Soraya and the Mike Curb College of Arts, Media, and Communication share an integral link that enhances student access and opportunities in the arts and performing arts. A \$5 million contribution from record producer and former California Lieutenant Governor Mike Curb was pivotal in ensuring the completion and opening of The Soraya in 2011.
