## **Jeremy Jordan** **Two-Time Tony-Nominated star** ***Of The Great Gatsby, Floyd Collins, Little Shop of*** ***Horrors, and Newsies,*** **Makes his Debut at The Soraya**

**(Los Angeles, CA) March 24, 2026** —Just weeks after concluding his Tony Award-nominated performance in *The Great Gatsby*, Broadway musical star **Jeremy Jordan** will make his debut at The Soraya on Saturday, April 11 at 8 p.m. before returning to New York where he will step into the role of Bobby Darin in the Broadway hit, *Just in Time* on April 21.

Triumphing in the title role of Broadway’s *The Great Gatsby*, Jeremy Jordan secured a place in the top echelon of Broadway stars. For more than a decade, he amassed credits starting with his breakout roles on televisions’ “Smash” and his Tony-nominated turns in Broadway’s *Floyd Collins* and *Newsies*. The young tenor with the four-octave range has not stopped since, now joining Eva Noblezada, Megan Hilty, and more on the long list of Broadway royalty with concert performances at The Soraya.

Jordan makes is Soraya debut with a set list he hopes will inspire fans from all eras of his career and will “definitely” include a few *Newsies* hits.

“It’s always a grab bag as to what I might bring to the show. I always try to touch on the hits and some of the latest things I’ve done,” he said in a recent interview with Soraya Executive and Artistic Director Thor Steingraber, adding that he is excited for his return to the West Coast.

“Performing on the West Coast is fantastic. The audiences are amazing and they are super cultured. It’s almost kind of like a second New York for me in terms of — I feel I can lay down all the inside jokes...and I never feel like I have to pick a ‘safe’ set list when I go out West.”

On the transition from performing with a full cast to doing a solo gig with just his band, Jordan said once he got over the nerves of being the primary focus, he realized how much he loves to entertain an audience with his own selections.

“It’s very empowering to get to do a solo show — it’s a little frightening as well because you think, ‘Well...I hope they like it!’ ... It makes it a lot easier because these are songs that I know, these are songs that I love,” he said, smiling endearingly as he said it is always a delight to entertain fans who he’s already won over.

**About Jeremy Jordan**

Jeremy Jordan was born and raised in Corpus Christi, Texas. He was always a singer, but at the age of 17, he accidentally fell in love with acting when cast as The Mute in the musical, *The Fantasticks*. After high school, Jeremy went on to study drama at Ithaca College and moved to New York City.

He earned himself two Tony nominations for Best Leading Actor in a Musical (*Newsies*, 2012 and *Floyd Collins*, 2025) and won a Theatre World Award in 2012 for his portrayal of Clyde Barrow in *Bonnie & Clyde*. He also received nominations from The GRAMMY® Awards, Drama Desk Awards, Drama League Awards, Outer Critics Circle Awards, and The Astaire Awards. Other Broadway/Theatre credits include *Just in Time*, *Floyd Collins*, *The Great Gatsby* (Broadway and World Premiere, Paper Mill Playhouse), *Waitress*, *Rock of Ages*, *West Side Story*, *American Son*, *Finding Neverland* (American Repertory Theatre), and *Little Shop of Horrors* (Westside Theatre). On Television he’s portrayed Jimmy Collins in NBC’s “Smash,” Winn Schott in the CW series, “Supergirl,” and voiced the role of Varian in Disney’s “Tangled: The Series,” and Lucifer Morningstar in Amazon Prime’s adult animated musical comedy series “Hazbin Hotel.” He starred in the film adaptation of *The Last Five Years* opposite Anna Kendrick. He reprised his Tony nominated role of Jack Kelly for the *Newsies* film and has also starred in the biopic *Spinning Gold* and several Hallmark films. Other film and television credits include *Joyful Noise*, “Law & Order: SVU,” “The Flash,” and “Elementary.”

Jeremy has been performing his solo cabarets to sold out audiences around the US and London since 2014 and made his solo Carnegie Hall Debut in October 2019. You can also catch Jeremy performing with his band, Age of Madness.
